



Visiting International Student Program Innovation and Art of Discovery Summer Class July 16 to August 12, 2017

Participants will take a regular class that is offered to UW-Madison students. Also international students from various countries may take this class. Thus, there will be an opportunity to study along with multi-national students. Students will be able to analyze real-world problems and develop creative solutions under multi-disciplinary environment while working as a team. Through creative thinking steps and art of discovery to be learned through lectures and practices, students will be able to make existing problems, products, projects, and art work innovative and unique. Students will receive official UW-Madison student identification card and can obtain an official transcript from the University.

There will be two hours of lectures and two hours of team project work per a day and weekly fieldtrips to various facilities and companies. Professor Jim Park and invited lecturers will team-teach the class. Students will have opportunities to meet local people in various professionals in the evening as part of social activities.

Eligibility: Any undergraduate students can participate in this program regardless of their majors.
